

Where are the red-light cameras?

What should I do if I receive a notice?

If you receive a notice, go to www.violationinfo.com and logon with the information provided on the notice. There you can view video of the incident and the images captured.

How much is the fine and what about my driving record?

The Notice of Violations will be assessed a \$158 statutory penalty and no points will be assessed. This will not appear on your driving record.

If the fine is not paid by the due date, a "Uniform Traffic Citation" will be issued and the fine will increase to \$264. Failure to pay the UTC will result in your driver's license being suspended for non-payment. UTC's are recorded on your driving record as a red-light camera citation but no points will be assessed.

What happens when you make a left or right turn at an intersection monitored by a red-light safety camera?

If a vehicle is completely within the intersection at the time the light turns red, you will not be issued a violation.

Right Turn: A red-light violation occurs if the motorist completes the right turn in a non-careful and prudent manner.

Right Turn with 'No Turn on Red' sign: A red-light violation occurs when a motorist completes a right turn at the intersection.

Travel safely in our community

Pursuant to the Mark Wandall Traffic Safety Act, the owner of a motor vehicle is liable for payment of a minimum civil penalty of \$158 if the owner's vehicle proceeds into an intersection equipped with a photographic traffic control monitoring system when the traffic control signal for that vehicle's direction of travel is emitting a steady red signal.

Red-Light Safety Camera Program



Why install red-light safety cameras?

Traffic studies show that red-light running is a problem at many intersections throughout Medley. The NHTSA states in 2011, **over 80 Floridians lost their lives making Florida the 3rd most deadly state** in the nation for red-light running crashes. The Town of Medley is committed to the safety of the community and dedicated to reducing red-light violations and their potential for crashes and injuries on our roadways.

Run a red light – save only seconds.

Nationally, **712 people were killed and more than 100,000 were injured** in collisions that involved red-light running in 2011. About half of the deaths in red-light running crashes are pedestrians, bicyclists, and occupants in other vehicles who are hit by the red-light runners.

We want to change driver behavior. Do they really save lives?

Public safety is the highest priority of the Medley Police Department and we believe the red-light safety camera program will help make our roadways safer for both residents and visitors of our community. These cameras are another way our Department is using technology to improve public safety.

Unfortunately, too many drivers choose to ignore traffic signals and think running a red-light is “no big deal.” We want to change this mindset and make sure people driving in our city know, red means stop.

National and international research shows cameras reduce red-light running violations and the life-threatening T-bone collisions that can result when vehicles collide in the middle of

an intersection. The II HS study found red-light cameras saved more than **150 lives** in 14 of the country's largest cities in 2011. The Federal Highway Administration studies show a **40–50% reduction in red-light running**.


Police can't be at an intersection 24/7.

The Medley Police Department simply does not have enough police officers to enforce red-light running violations at every dangerous intersection in the town using conventional methods.

Red-light safety cameras are a valuable tool that enable PD to uniformly enforce traffic laws while responding to community policing needs.

HOW IT WORKS

- The system activates when motion is detected just prior to the stop bar AFTER the traffic signal has turned red. The cameras capture two images of an alleged violation, taken from the rear of the vehicle.
- The first image shows the vehicle at the white stop bar and the illuminated red light.
- The second image shows the violator in the middle of the intersection with the red light illuminated.
- The license plate image is a close-up from one of the images captured.
- Data, including the time, date, and duration of the yellow and red lights, also is recorded.
- Cameras also record a 12-second digital video of the violation, including six seconds prior to and six seconds after running the red light.
